Young native broadleaved planting at Corehead provides opportunity for woodland and habitat expansion.

Borders Forest Trust site with the objective to create native broadleaved woodland with varied density & sensitive habitats retained as open ground.

Existing access to be protected, & an extensive open ride network will provide opportunities for informal recreation. Internal fencing will be removed to keep routes unobstructed.

Scottish Woodlands Ltd. site with the objective to create a working woodland with long-term timber output and native planting targeted near watercourses.

The planting design will be informed by Archaeological & Ecological surveys which are currently underway.

Within the site the Annandale Way is to be upgraded to a forestry track with opportunities to install rest benches.

Woodland areas recorded as being of Ancient Semi-natural origin. Opportunity to protect, regenerate & expand.

Sites of historic interest to be protected.
