

WESTER KINLEITH WOODLAND CREATION PROPOSALS

Rosebery Estates, assisted by Scottish Woodlands Ltd., have produced draft proposals for a woodland creation scheme at Wester Kinleith, by Balerno.

The views of the local community and site users are being sought to contribute to the development of the project.

Context

The **Scottish Government** supports woodland creation as part of future land use in Scotland. This will contribute to:

- Fulfil targets on Climate Change (carbon sequestration 18,000 ha of new woodland per annum)
- Fulfil targets on Biodiversity
- Help underpin a Sustainable Supply of Wood Products to the Scottish forestry industry

The 'Lothians Forestry and Woodland Strategy' indicates that the site location is in a 'preferred area' for woodland expansion.

The 'Pentland Hills Regional Park Strategic Management Plan' identifies appropriate woodland expansion as means of supporting the local economy.


Objectives

The primary objective is:

O to produce timber in the medium and long term through the establishment of productive woodlands.

Secondary objectives are:

- O to develop an enhanced, wooded landscape, achieved through the creation of sensitively designed woodlands
- O to protect and enhance existing recreational provision
- O to protect and enhance biodiversity values
- O to combat climate change through carbon sequestration
- O to protect key areas of identified cultural heritage interest.



Design & Application Process

The design process has included specialist survey and assessment of:

Soils and Peat

- No areas of deep peat were found
- Soils are generally fertile, capable of supporting a wide range of species
- No ploughing is proposed

Habitats, Birds and Animals

- Independent specialist Habitats, Birds and Protected Species surveys have been completed
- Any habitats of identified regional and local interest will be protected and retained in open ground
- New habitats will be created, notably through establishment of new native woodlands
- Existing floristic interest on Bell's Hill will be sustained by continued grazing

Design & Application Process

The design process has included specialist survey and assessment of:


Cultural Heritage


- All identified features of interest will be protected as recommended in the independent specialist report
- It is hoped to involve local archaeologists in further investigative works

Landscape


- The woodland has been designed to fit with the local topography and to include a range of woodland types and open ground
- Efforts have been made to mirror the character of the existing woods
- Visual perspectives have been generated to show the impact of the proposals on the future landscape







• If approval is granted by Scottish Forestry, woodland establishment works would be likely to be undertaken in winter 25/26 or 26/27
