



Timber Transport Route:
The B8000 is a timber transport consultation route

Local Landscape Character:
Forest sits within the Bute and South Cowal Local Landscape Area

Cowal Way Core Path:
The Cowal Way footpath passes through the northern end of the woodland, no impacts to the footpath are foreseen as a result of planned operations.

Opportunity to enhance landscape and visual impact through phased felling and restructuring. For example, first rotation straight forest boundaries in the north and south of the forest may be ameliorated through coupe design and species choice

Protected Species:
There is the potential for protected species to be present in this woodland, including Red Squirrel, Black Grouse, Otters, and Raptors.

Pre-operational wildlife surveys will be carried out to detect signs of any species, and appropriate mitigations will be put in place

Age Class:
Opportunity for phased felling and restructuring to increase age class diversity and enhance visual impact

Wildlife Habitats:
Opportunity to improve connectivity and habitats for wildlife through the creation of wildlife corridors, planting of native species, designed open ground, and linking riparian areas

Watercourse:
There are several named watercourses present in this woodland. The Allt a' Chuilinn and Allt na Cruime drain easterly into the Kyles of Bute. The Allt a' Chaorainn drains westerly into the Allt Osda, which is part of the Loch Fyne Coastal Catchment, and has a moderate status.

Forest and Water Guidelines will be followed to ensure there are no negative impacts to any watercourses as a result of operations.

Schedule 1 birds have been present in this woodland

Ancient Woodland:
Opportunity to improve the condition of areas of semi natural ancient woodland, through the removal of non-native and invasive species.

Overhead Powerline:
There is an overhead powerline that passes through the south-western edge of the woodland. No impacts to the overhead powerline are foreseen as a result of planned operations.

Historic Features:
There are several unscheduled historic features present in this woodland. These sites will be marked on maps and their location buffered on the ground during operations which would have the potential to impact upon it.

Private Water Supply:
There is a private water supply serving Glenahuil Farm
