There is potential for protected species to be present in the forest, for example badgers, red squirrels, pine martin and raptors. Restructuring of the forest provides opportunity for habitat enhancement which will benefit a range of species, for example, through the planting of a more diverse selection of tree species and identifying areas of the forest that may be suitable for long term retention.  
  
Pre operational surveys will be carried out to detect signs of any species, and appropriate mitigations will be put in place

The forest is predominantly of a mature even aged character. Phased felling and restructuring will provide an opportunity to diversify the age structure and species composition to enhance landscape character and biodiversity and ensure that the forest is compliant with the requirements of the United Kingdom Forest Standard.
